Why Aquaculture & Cat Fish?

- Aquaculture valued at \$289.6B in 2022, projected to reach **\$412.2B** by 2030.
- Fish makes up 40% of Nigeria's protein intake, with 13.3 kg consumed per capita annually
- Nigeria faces a fish supply gap, importing 2.5M tonnes annually.
- The **№2.6B** catfish industry is vital faces resource regulatory challenges
- Nigeria is a key catfish exporter to the US, Europe, and the Middle East



- Only 40% of Nigeria's 84 million hectares of fertile land is cultivated.
- Nigeria imports \$10 billion in food to bridge agricultural gaps.
